Some Guidelines For Public Speaking And Teaching

- 1. Be thoroughly familiar with the subject matter. (1 Tim. 1:3-7, 2 Tim. 1:13/2:2)
- 2. Prayer & meditation are important. (Phil. 4:6-8, Col. 4:2-6, James 1:25)
- 3. As much as possible, know the audience and gear the lesson toward them. (1 Cor. 3:1-2, Acts 10:27-29,37)
- 4. Speak in terms that are simple and understandable. (1 Cor. 14:2,4,6,9,11, 2 Cor. 1:13)
- 5. Use a positive approach, affirmation rather than condemnation. (2 Cor. 1:18-20, 2 Cor. 1:23-2:4, 2 Cor. 5:20, 1 Cor. 4:18-21)
- 6. Stay on the subject. (Matt. 10:7, Acts 17:2-4, 2 Tim. 2:14-16, Titus 1:9-11)
- 7. For discussion, questions beginning with "how, when, what, why, or who" are good. (Matt. 16:13-15, Matt. 18:21ff, Matt. 19:16-30, Matt. 21:23-27ff)
- 8. Watch for audience response, maintain contact with others in the study, be a good listener. (Matt. 9:1-9, 9:10-12, 9:35-39, John 6:41-43)
- 9. Stay in control. Don't let the meeting or yourself get out of hand. (Acts 14:8-18, Acts 15:4-7,12,13,22, 1 Cor. 14:29-33)
- 10. Be prepared to recognize and admit your own limitations. (2 Cor. 2:12-13, Matt. 17:14-21, Matt. 24:36, Dan. 2:16-18)
- 11. Avoid sarcasm. It often hurts and is easily misunderstood. (Prov. 9:12, 22:10, Matt. 5:37)
- 12. Try to start and end on time. (Acts 13:42, Acts 20:7-12, Ex. 12:6-10)
- 13. Remember how much Christ loves those you are talking to. Remember the value of a soul and the potential of those present. (1 Cor. 9:19-23, 2 Cor. 5:11, 14-21)
